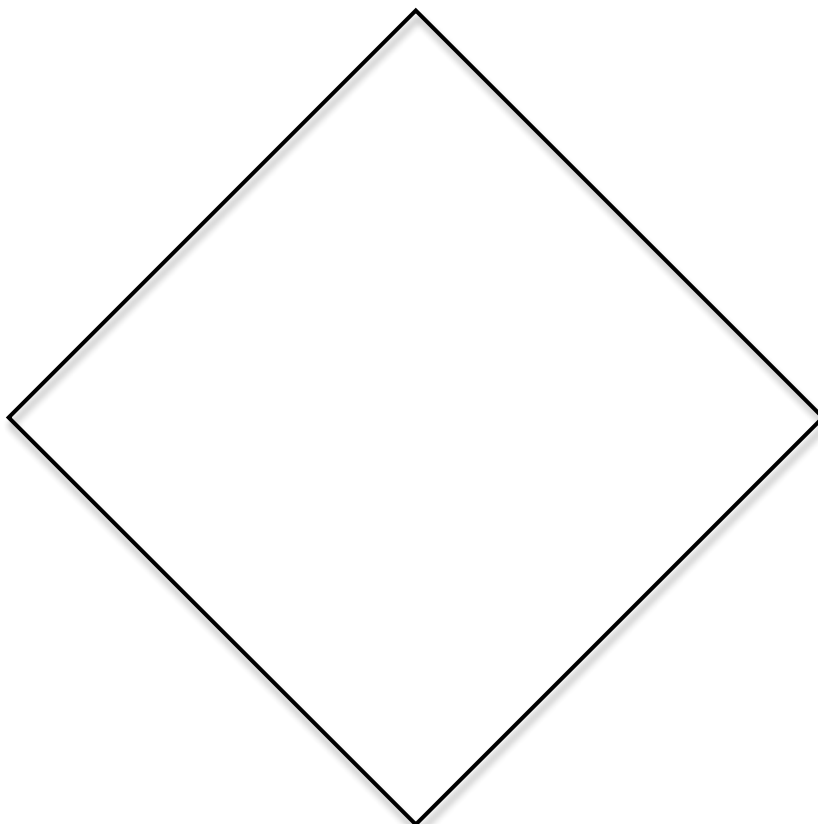
This worksheet will guide you around the gallery and help you to explore the photographs!

Can you find the winning photograph?

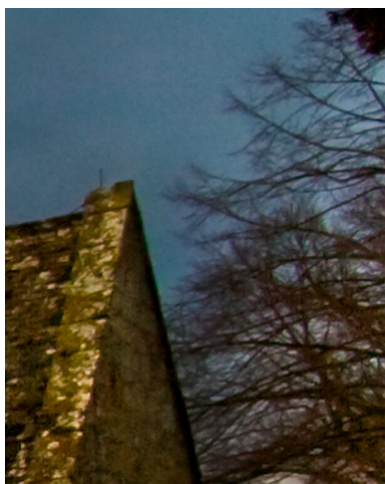
Who is it by and what is it?.....

Look carefully and you will see one photograph has the name of the tower, what is it called?.....

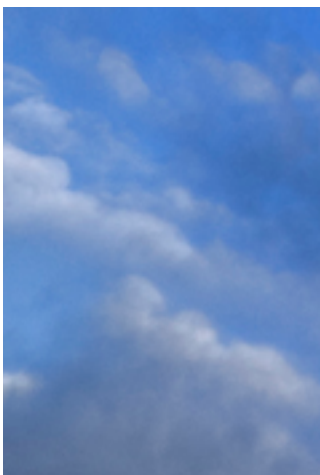
